Sustainability Policy

1. Vision Statement

At Bunyan Preschool, we are committed to embedding sustainability into our daily routines. We aim to teach young children the importance of caring for our planet through **play-based learning and real-life experiences**, nurturing environmentally responsible behaviours that will last a lifetime.

2. Key Focus Areas & Actions

A. Reducing Waste & Recycling

- Encourage children to recycle by clearly labelling bins for general waste and recycling. Visual posters will guide what can be placed in each bin.
- Promote reusable containers and encourage families to provide litter-free packed lunches.
- Use recycled materials for arts and crafts instead of purchasing new supplies whenever possible.

B. Energy & Water Conservation

- Teach children and remind staff to turn off lights when leaving a room, using visual reminders as prompts.
- Encourage turning off taps while washing hands to reduce water wastage.

C. Outdoor Learning & Nature Connection

- Take children outside regularly for nature walks to explore local biodiversity.
- Use the garden area for children to plant and care for flowers, fruits, and vegetables.
- Introduce bug hotels, bird feeders, and hedgehog or squirrel houses to support wildlife.
- Engage children in leaf collecting, sensory play, and outdoor storytelling to foster a love for nature.

D. Sustainable Resources

- Use eco-friendly practices such as refilling soap and washing liquid dispensers from larger reusable bottles instead of single-use small pots.
- Choose wooden or recycled materials for toys and furniture rather than plastic.
- Reduce paper waste by using whiteboards, reusable writing boards, and recycled paper.

E. Eco-Friendly Transport & Air Quality

Encourage walking or cycling for drop-offs and pickups whenever possible.

- Educate children about the importance of clean air.
- Organize "Walk to Preschool" challenges with rewards for participation.

F. Climate Awareness & Early Education

- Read books and tell stories about nature, recycling, and caring for the Earth.
- Engage in songs and activities that promote sustainability (e.g., sorting recyclables).
- Celebrate Earth Day and other environmental events with themed activities.
- Involve children in small eco-projects, such as growing plants or upcycling old materials.

3. Staff & Family Engagement

- Provide families with simple sustainability tips to encourage eco-friendly practices at home.
- Share updates on noticeboards and through regular communications.

4. Monitoring & Review

- Assign an Eco Champion from the staff team to oversee progress and coordinate initiatives.
- Conduct an annual review to update and improve the action plan based on feedback and new ideas.
